MOUNT OF ASCENSION—The Current Rule of Christ

A Parable of an imaginary country – or is it only a parable?

Acts 1:1-11 (NASB)

As central as the virgin birth, the sacrificial death and the bodily resurrection are to the Christian faith, SO IS THE ASCENSION.

Jesus Christ ascended into heaven where he sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty.

From The Apostles Creed (app. AD 400)

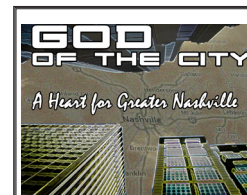
What does it mean that Jesus was bodily resurrected?

Jesus had not been resuscitated as had Lazarus or the son of the widow of Nain or Jairus' daughter. His Resurrection was not a return to the former bodily existence that was mortal and would face death again. Jesus had passed through death and out the other side into a new order of being...a 'spiritual body' ...a Spirit-driven body... H. Ray Dunning, page 113

What does it mean that Jesus ascended? The ascension of Jesus, then, was the enthronement of the King following his conquest of evil and the inauguration of God's kingdom...the entrance of his glorified body into heaven. Jesus became absent in order to be present with his followers everywhere and always. H. Ray Dunning, page 113

The liberated have not lost their liberator. The liberator is now seated at the right hand of God and continues to rule in the new creation that his death and resurrection have brought into reality...the ascension of Jesus is the historical attestation of the reality of Christ's ongoing lordship.
